As the Senior Family and Consumer Sciences Extension Agent, Sarah Burkett works primarily with families and youth in Pulaski to provide research-based educational programs. The Extension Leadership Council along with Family and Consumer Sciences Advisory Council identify community issues and problems Ms. Burkett should address. Since foods, nutrition and health are her specialty areas, she receives numerous training requests in the following areas: adult programs to diminish disease risks, an in-school nutrition program for all second/third graders and adult/youth health/fitness programs. <u>New Life Recovery Center (Residential Substance Abuse Services)</u>

The residential rehabilitation services at New Life Recovery Center provide treatment for addicted individuals in a residential environment so they can be removed from the situations in which they are most likely to relapse, at a time when they are the most vulnerable. The program provides individual and group therapy for the clients, as well as education about addiction and case management. This includes planning to get them back into an environment that will be more supportive of their decision to stop using alcohol or drugs. New Life Recovery Center is located in Fairlawn.
