PAS-ADD Checklist (Revised)

The PAS-ADD Checklist axis about behaviours which sometimes happen if a person has poor mental heads. The Checklist aims so hadp stuff and cases to decide whether assuments of an individual's mental heads in may be helpful. The present completing the Checklist should have known the individual for at lease six months; if possible. If you do not have all the information you need, try to get it; for example, if you know the person only during the day, you may not know how well they deep, and you may with to ask someone whome information is reliable. Before rating, it is important to ensure that the person does not have any uncorrected haring or bioin problems. Such problems can rmall in sproptoms which may be confused with mental headth problems.


