Linda Johnson & Stephanie Bryson	Women’s Resource Center	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Presented information on “Peaceline”, a primary prevention program in schools (grades 6-10) that focuses on violence, rape, and sexual assault prevention • Fact sheet about the program and curriculum for each grade level was sent out with the minutes • Peaceline programming is implemented throughout the NRV Health & PE programs, but can also visit as a guest speaker • Services from the WRC are free (supported by grants and donations) and they offer services to men, women, and children

Logic Model Workgroup & YADAPP</p>		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nycole deLeeuw updated the coalition on the progress of the Logic Model Workgroup and YADAPP/youth involvement in coalition • The workgroup (Richelle Price, Pam Ray, Doug Perry, Nycole deLeeuw) has been meeting to develop a logic model to guide prevention efforts in Montgomery County based on YRBS and other data sources and youth focus groups • If interested in joining the Logic Model Workgroup contact Nycole deLeeuw, <u>ndeleeuw@nrvc.org</u> • Nycole deLeeuw met with YADAPP (Youth Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention Project) students on June 14th to gather information about issues among students at Eastern Montgomery High School. Summary of focus group was sent with the minutes. Youth will be attending YADAPP summer conference, July 16-20th, where they will be developing a STAN plan to prevent substance abuse in their school • Tracy Smith-ABC responded to conversation with information about a “very good” fake Virginia ID going around. As a result, ABC is sending more agents into bars. Minors are ordering ID’s online, \$100 gets you two IDs in case one gets taken. One way to tell the difference between a fake and real Virginia ID is to drop the ID at an angle onto a surface. The real VA ID will sound metallic while the fake ID will sound like a credit card (plastic). Virginia ID’s also start with a letter followed by a 6 or a 1. Literature about identifying fake IDs is available on the ABC website • Youth will be encouraged to attend August meeting (either in person, through recorded video, or facetime)
