Meeting Minutes Town of Pulaski Train Station

- **I.** Welcome, introductions, and announcements: Anthony Akers, Chair, opened the meeting with introductions of those present at 11:00am on May 2, 2018.
- **II. Approval of Agenda:** Sally Warburton asked to add Red Ribbon Week to 2018 Events. Pam Ray moved to accept the agenda with the addition; Sally seconded & the motion was passed.
- **III.** Approval of Minutes April 11, 2018: minutes were approved as written.
- **IV.** ACEs (Adverse Childhood Experiences): Kathy Kenley and Leslie Beasley of NRVCS presented an informational program on ACEs. A discussion followed.
- V. Financial Report: Sally Warburton, Treasurer, reported that there is a balance of \$11,763.65 in the account. Rhonda Dean stated that the only outstanding invoice is one for \$400 for Pulaski Proud t-shirts which will be printed at Extreme Color Works.
- VI. Nominations for Secretary: There is a vacancy left by Kat Saunders' resignation. Pam Ray nominated Asa McKee for the position. There being no other nominations & Asa's acceptance of the position, Pam made a motion, Lisa Webb seconded and the motion passed unanimously.
- VII. 2018 Events
 - After Prom Coffee House (4/21/2018): Sally and Rhonda reported that the Coffee House was a success. Sally also gave a special thank you to Rhonda's daughter Riley who helped the entire time from set-up through clean-up and served the students. Since we had fewer volunteers this year, Riley was a huge help.
 - Drug Take Backs (4/28/2018): 174 pounds was brought to the Town of Pulaski site at Food City; 25 pounds was brought to the Walmart Fairlawn site which was added to the drop box at the sheriff's office for a total of 119 pounds; and 63 pounds was taken in at the Dublin CVS.
 - Transitional Pool Parties (August): tabled at this time
 - National Night Out: the local celebration will be on August 7, 2018 at Jackson Park in Pulaski. PCPC will have a booth.
 - Red Ribbon Week: Sally suggested that a committee be formed to consider purchasing tshirts with an anti-drug slogan for all of the 5th graders. This might make a bigger impact in the community than the \$100 that is given to each school. A discussion ensued that included suggestions to hold a contest to create a slogan and encouraging businesses to partner with a door decal or red door bow.
