Spotlight: Lois Curtis

Lois Curtis is a black artist and activist with a mental health disability and intellectual/developmental disability.

During her childhood and early adulthood, she lived in state-run institutions, and her requests to live in the community were repeatedly denied.

She sued the state of Georgia, and her case went to the Supreme Court. In the now-famous L.C. v. Olmstead decision, the Court declared that Curtis 70.1 minutes

DayCape is an app that allows therapists, teachers, parents, and even the child themselves to set up visual schedules.

Benefiting grades pre-k through 5th, this app is an excellent way to help children with a variety of disabilities to manage their day.

The app allows a user to set up activities for for the child using pre-set pictures, or by uploading personalized images.

Once the activities are set up, notifications show up on the child's device to remind them of the activities they have been assigned.



What Should I Expect?

So you've used CoverVA's <u>eligibility screening tool</u> and believe you may qualify for health care coverage. What's next?

Here's some important information you should have ready when you apply:

- Full legal name, date of birth, Social Security number, citizenship or immigration status for you and anyone in your household who is applying for health care coverage
- Most recent federal tax filing information (if available)
- Job and income information (pay stubs, W-2s) for members of your household for the month prior or the current month
- Information about other taxable income for members of your household such as unemployment benefits, Social Security benefits, pensions, retirement income, rental income, and alimony received
- · Policy numbers for any current health insurance

Once you've collected this information there are 3 easy ways to apply:

- 1. Call Cover Virginia at 1-855-242-8282 from 8:00 am to 7:00 pm on Monday through Friday, or call from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm on Saturday.
- 2. Apply online at commonhelp.virginia.gov or healthcare.gov.
- 3. Visit your local Department of Social Services.


