



Two-session Virtual Training on Pivotal Response Treatment

September 21 and 28 from 9am-11am - LIVE WEBINAR

Presented by: Angela Scarpa Ph.D. & Angela Dahiya, M.S. Hosted by: CA Human Services

Join us for this 2-part online series for professionals or parents who would like foundational information on Pivotal Response Treatment (PRT), which is aimed at teaching language skills to minimally-verbal children. We will provide an overview of the treatment, PRT motivational strategies, and how to generalize this treatment to other target behaviors.

This training will provide a foundational overview of:

- > Autism Spectrum Disorder interventions and PRT treatment
 - > PRT behavioral basics (the ABC's of behaviors)
 - ➤ How to structure learning opportunities
- ➤ How to generalize PRT strategies to improve future target behaviors

It's important to know where the COVID-19 testing sites are in case you or a loved one becomes symptomatic.


