



The house is designed as a 3 bed residence with primary and secondary kitchen areas, two sensory support spaces, indoor and outdoor design to support individuals who have experienced long term and

sustained housing and community integration barriers due to complex behavioral needs.

The environment of the home including design lay out, furniture, bedroom, living and dining areas, indoor and outdoor space were carefully developed, designed and furnished for the focus and support of highly complex individual's ability to reside in an optimal and integrated setting.

Tara Lane II staff are specialized and trained to support these individuals with complex behavior care needs through specific current and ongoing training in an evaluated and individualized staffing pattern focused on individual support needs of residents enjoying and living their life in their community.


Do You Know Where to Go to Get a COVID-19 Test?


