## **Black History Month is here!**

This month we would like to highlight historical figure, Psychologist Mamie Phipps Clark, PhD (1917-1983), seen above with her husband, Psychologist Kenneth Clark, PhD.

Her work with children showed that African American children became aware of their racial identity at about three years old. Many of these children began to see, reflect, and internalize the views that society held about them.

She also found that many African American children who were tested and informed they had a learning disability or were disabled were diagnosed incorrectly due to biased psychological testing.\*
