

When combined with smell it helps increase the plasticity of the brain and its ability to compensate for damage and various dysfunctions. This is why Sensory Enrichment Therapy™ includes many exercises that combine touch and smell.

WHAT: The primary goal of AMPP (Autism Mentor Parent Program) is to provide families with the support and information they need to successfully navigate their child's Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) diagnosis and treatment process. Trained parents (mentors) will share their experiences and help provide encouragement to other parents (mentees) as they learn to navigate their new reality.

The purpose of the current study is to pilot the use of an online mentor-mentee matching program for parents of children with ASD. Usefulness, satisfaction and sustainability of the program will be evaluated via parent report pre and post participation.

ASSET Study: Managing Emotions for Teens with ASD
