

Strokes affect almost 800,000 Americans every year and are considered medical emergencies. Strokes or "brain attacks" occur when blood flow to part of the brain is blocked. If you suspect that someone is having a stroke, remember to think "FAST" and perform a "FAST" check:

Face – ask the person to smile. Does one side of their face droop?

Arm – ask the person to raise both arms. Does one side drift downward?

<u>Speech</u> – ask the person to repeat a simple sentence or tell you where they live. Is their speech slurred or are they unable to form words?

<u>Time</u> – if you suspect a stroke from any of these signs or other symptoms, note the time and call 911 immediately.

Did you know that calling 911 for a suspected stroke is better than driving yourself to the hospital and gives you the best chance for survival and recovery?




The Virginia Autism Council
