

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Featured Psychologist: Joseph White, PhD

Joseph L. White is sometimes referred to as 'the father of Black psychology.'

- He wrote the groundbreaking article "Toward a Black Psychology," which
 is credited as the first-ever strengths-based (rather than deficit-based)
 evaluation and description of Black behavior and culture.
- He passionately advocated for the creation of Black psychology, arguing that applying white psychology to Black people often unfairly created the illusion of Black inferiority, when ultimately it was a reflection of the culturally irrelevant psychological principles being applied.
- Not only that, he also helped found the association of Black Psychologist as the Black Studies program at San Francisco State University in 1968.





REACH Region III Is Hiring!

The **REACH** program is the statewide crisis system of care that is designed to meet the crisis support needs of individuals who have a developmental disability and are experiencing crisis events which put them at risk for homelessness, incarceration, hospitalization, and/or danger to self or others.

REACH services are available statewide, with one regional program being located in each of the Commonwealth's five DD regions.

REACH Mission Statement

Individuals with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities shall be supported with services that allow the individual to live the most inclusive life possible in his/her community which includes access to appropriate and effective crisis stabilization, intervention, and prevention services including mental health treatment services when indicated.




The Virginia Tech Autism Clinic


